observation of hemodynamic parameters over time such as blood pressure and heart rate blood pressure can be monitored either invasively

through an inserted blood pressure transducer assembly providing continuous monitoring or noninvasively by repeatedly measuring the blood pressure with an inflatable blood pressure cuff
