osmolarity is the measure of solute concentration defined as the number of osmoles of solute per litre l of solution osmol l or osm l the osmolarity of a solution is usually expressed as osm l pronounced osmolar in the same way that the molarity of a solution is expressed as

web may 9 2019 osmolarity is defined as the number of osmoles of solute per liter l of a solution it is expressed in terms of osmol l or osm l osmolarity depends on the number of particles in a chemical solution but not on the identity of those molecules or ions sample osmolarity calculations a 1 mol l nacl solution has an osmolarity of 2 osmol l

measure distinct from molarity it is related to other colligative properties of solutions including freezing point depression vapour pressure depression and boiling point elevation the tolerance of environments of high osmolarity and the specific requirement for nacl are distinct phenomena

web osmolality tests measure the amount of certain substances in blood urine or stool these include glucose sugar urea a waste product made in the liver and several electrolytes such as sodium potassium and chloride electrolytes are electrically charged minerals they help control the amount of fluids in your body
