Challenges of Education Financing and Planning in Africa: What Works and What Does Not Work - Adebayo Olukoshi 2007-01-15

This volume highlights the proceedings of the two policy dialogue conferences held by the Working Group on Finance and Education (WGFE) in 2004. Part I of the document discusses the endemic crisis that higher education has been beset with since the outset of the post colonial period in Africa. It highlights the critical state of higher education systems in Burkina Faso, Mali, Nigeria and Senegal by scrutinizing the causes, manifestations and consequences of the crisis to posit useful recommendations and possible solutions. Part II is a comprehensive review of the challenges facing the financing and planning of all levels and types of education - from kindergarten to graduate school - in selected African countries. The papers reveal the sources and mechanisms of funding education in Africa, drawing attention to the experiences of communities confronted with new funding sources. A new trend, which consists of designing decade long educational development plans, has emerged and is rapidly

expanding in numerous African countries. This experience is examined and shared by the authors. This book has contributions in both French and English.

Culture as a Vocation - Vincent Dubois

Vocational occupations are attractive not so much for their material rewards as for the prestige and self-fulfillment they confer. They require a strong personal commitment, which can be subjectively experienced in terms of passion and selflessness. The choice of a career in the cultural sector provides a good example of this. What are the terms of this calling? What predisposes individuals to answer it? What are the meanings of such a choice? To answer these questions, this book focuses on would-be cultural managers. By identifying their social patterns, by revealing the resources, expectations and visions of the world they invest in their choice, it sheds new light on these occupations. In these intermediary and indeterminate social positions, family heritages intersect with educational strategies, aspirations of upward mobility with tactics against downward mobility, and social critique with adjustment strategies. Ultimately the study of career choices in cultural management suggests a new take on the analysis of social reproduction and on the embodiment of the new spirit of capitalism. The empirical findings of this research conducted in France are set in a broader comparative perspective, at the European level and with the USA.

It also analyses the experiences of men and women who teach, looking at the way gender and power impact on their careers and private lives in the context of the feminisation debate. This edited collection explores the genesis of Bourdieu's classical book *Distinction* and its international career in contemporary Social Sciences. The twenty-five crisp and amusing short stories in this collection prove that elementary readings in French can also be entertaining. Some are original anecdotes and others adaptations of traditional French or French-Canadian stories, some are from anonymous sources, and some by acknowledged masters such as LaFontaine. All are distinguished by the classic literary virtue of the French—precision, economy, and the traditional Gallic twist. A delightful series of line drawings by Antje Lingner aptly reflects the spirit of the book. This collection is designed for reading in Grades XI and XII, and for introductory courses at the University or Extension course level. To encourage a quick response and facility in reading, the stories emphasize the idiomatic and rely heavily on

dialogue, avoiding as much as possible an over-literary syntax. The text employs elementary vocabulary and constructions throughout and is representative in all respects of the spoken language today. The emphasis on conversational organization in the stories will be immediately apparent, and it is this feature that should be exploited in the classroom and other group situations. On a series of four long-playing records the entire text has been transcribed for use in oral and phonetics classes. The readings are given slowly but naturally and with a relish which catches the drama and humour of the material. The combination of text and recordings offers a most valuable method of acquiring aural familiarity with spoken French. The stories are supplemented with vocabulary, notes and exercises. For each story there is supplied a series of questions that lend themselves to oral answers and discussion; in addition there is a short exercise reviewing grammatical forms, with special emphasis on the verb, as well as a brief passage for prose translation into French. *French Politics and Society* - 1997

Role Of Women In The Development Of Science And Technology In The Third World - Proceedings Of The Conference Organized By The Canadian International Development Agency And The Third World Academy Of Sciences - A M Faruqi 1991-02-26

This conference was organised by the Third World Academy of Sciences in collaboration with the Canadian International Development Agency. For the 250 female scientist participants from distant lands and diverse cultures from the Caribbean to the Far East, the conference proved a stimulating experience to recognize their strength in terms of numbers and achievements, to forge new links, nationally and internationally, and to demonstrate that science is independent of gender and is no longer an exclusively male-dominated preserve. The first part of the proceedings deals with the global, Third World and national perspectives of the theme "Women and Science" and the second highlights the scientific contributions by Third World women scientists, their personal experiences and scientific reports. The publication of these proceedings would serve as a potentially effective strategy aimed at

enhancing the status of women scientists, not only in the Third World but worldwide.

Professeurs-- mais femmes - Marlaine Cacouault 2007

Femme et professeur. C'est au XXe siècle que se féminise le métier de professeur, en même temps que l'enseignement dans son ensemble. Que furent ces carrières de femmes professeurs ? Comment ont-elles conjugué leurs aspirations professionnelles et leur vie privée, maritale, familiale et affective ? Comment ont-elle vécu cette dynamique de promotion sociale alors que, paradoxalement, on parle d'une dévalorisation du professorat " après la guerre ? La vaste enquête de sociologie historique que présente Marlaine Cacouault-Bitaud en s'appuyant sur des données statistiques originales et sur des entretiens biographiques réalisés avec des enseignantes du secondaire recrutées entre 1920 et 1940, et entre 1960 et 1985, éclaire les mutations d'une profession rarement analysée sous l'angle du genre. Celui-ci révèle notamment le " plafond de verre " auquel se heurtent nombre de femmes qui exercent une profession intellectuelle et l'articulation problématique entre les demandes qui leur sont adressées dans la sphère domestique et l'exercice d'un métier exigeant. Cette histoire éclaire notre présent : aujourd'hui encore, à réussite scolaire égale, les femmes continuent de choisir plus souvent l'enseignement secondaire que le supérieur ou la recherche. Les questions soulevées ici concernent donc tout aussi bien les hommes,

dont la vie professionnelle ne repose pas moins, mais différemment, sur des choix de vie personnelle.

Heureux comme un professeur en France ? - Jean-Marie Tournier 2019-01-28T00:00:00Z

La première partie traite de la violence en général (l'homme est un animal violent...) puis de la violence à l'école (une tradition de violence et les nouvelles formes de violence), de ses causes (un âge difficile, les diktats de la publicité, les écrans, le libéralisme) et des réponses proposées (de la sévérité souvent à la douceur parfois). La deuxième partie parle du voile islamique et de l'islamophobie, du racisme dénoncé officiellement et encouragé en réalité, et des répercussions de ces questions à l'école. La troisième partie dit les difficultés du métier d'enseignant et son peu de reconnaissance par les politiques et la société. La quatrième partie aborde plus spécialement l'enseignement du français, son jargon insoutenable et ses prétentions démesurées, une grammaire absurde, des horaires inadaptés, des épreuves incohérentes. L'ouvrage propose enfin en cinquième partie (la plus courte) un éloge du français et des lettres, comme source de bonheur et guide de « bonne conduite ». Note: L'originalité de cet ouvrage est de toujours se référer à la littérature dans ses analyses : par exemple, pour parler de la violence à l'école, il a été fait appel notamment à Augustin d'Hippone, La Bruyère, Flaubert, Beaumarchais, Boris Vian...
